

AAUW VIRTUAL FUNDRAISER





Call to order:

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m.

Minutes:

Treasurer's Report:

Tracey reviewed her written report. Items of note were the activities due to minor membership updates, printing, and postage. The balance as of November 6, 2021 was \$2,350.58.
